

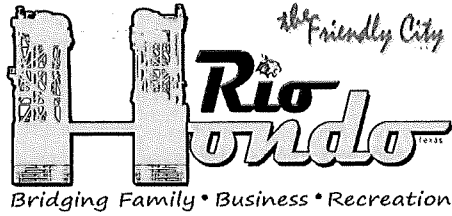

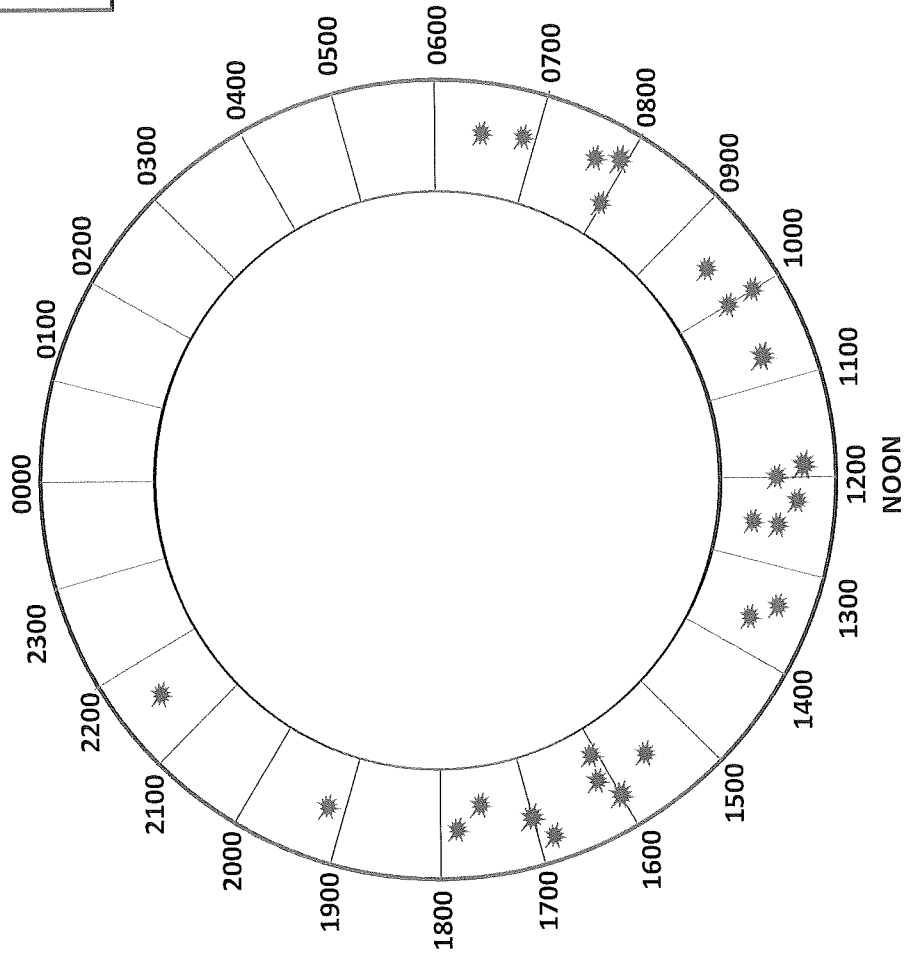

**Call meeting to Order by Mayor Olivares**

### **Regular Agenda:**

1. Mayor's and Commissioners' Reports
2. Reports: Administrator Mr. Medina reported that the Family Dollar will be opening in April, 2024
3. Public Comment Period: *Please Note- The Public Comment Period is designated for hearing concerns regarding City of Rio Hondo Public Policy or City of Rio Hondo business that is or is not on the agenda or items listed on the agenda.*
  - a. Mr. Jesse Izaguirre reported on the status of the Rio Hondo Sports League. They will be starting their season in March. They are in the process of preparing the fields for play and are restricting the use of the fields.
  - b. Mr. Micheal Adame stated to the City Commission that he needed to park his truck on a lot owned by AT&T and was advised by the Police Department that he could no longer be allowed to park at this location. Mr. Adame requested if the Parking Ordinance be reviewed to allow for permits to be issue to drivers needing a place to park their trucks.
4. Status Report on Boat Ramp Park Project. (Chris Rodriquez, Eng. And City Administrator). Mr. Medina gave a report on the status of the construction. The fishing pier is 40% complete and the sidewalks have being constructed.
5. Presentation of Financial Report. (Finance Manager and City Administrator). Mrs. Lucy Garza Finance Manager give the financial report for the month of January and is attached.
6. Consideration and Action on Resolution 2024-04 requesting financial assistance from the Texas Water Development Board for constructing various public improvements to the city's utility system. Mr. Medina presented the resolution and explained that this was need for the Water Well project. Commissioner Bocanegra motioned to approve Resolution 2024-04 and was seconded by Commissioner Perez and the motion carried.
7. Status Report on the raw water supplies for the City of Rio Hondo supplied by Cameron County Irrigation District No. 2. Mr. Medina presented and explained the 90 day letter sent by Cameron County Irrigation District No., 2. The city will need to buy push-water this summer.

8. Consideration and Action renaming the Parks Division to Greens Division and funding one full time position and appropriating general funds not to exceed \$38,000. After discussion on the item Commissioner Perez motioned to table the item seconded by Commissioner Cavazos and the motion carried..
9. Public Hearing on the Final Plat of Bridge View Subdivision consisting of 18.00 acres of land consisting of a portion of Block 138 and all of Block 139 through 141 Mcleod-Hood Subdivision. The Public Hearing was opened at 6:52. Omar Rodriquez the consulting engineer for the City presented the plat and explained the letter of comments. The Hearing was closed at 7:20 pm.
10. Consideration and Action on Resolution 2024- 06 adopting Bridge View Subdivision Final Plat. (City Administrator) Mr. Rodriquez the consulting engineer reviewing the plat requested the item be tabled. Commissioner Garza motioned to table the item and seconded by Commissioner Cavazos and the item carried.
11. Discussion of the Historic Elementary School Building Limited Facility Inspection Report. (City Administrator). Mr. Medina discussed possible uses of the building as outlined in the Limited Facility Report commissioned by the City. No action was taken.
12. Consideration and Action authorizing the City Attorney to review all land transfer agreements between the Rio Hondo Independent School District and the City of Rio Hondo. (City Administrator) Commissioner Perez moved to approve the the authorization for the preparation of transfer documents by the city attorney and the item was seconded by Commissioner Gallegos. The motion carried.
13. Executive Session: Discussion with legal counsel pursuant to Section 551.071 of the Texas Government Code regarding City Commission seats. City Commission went into Executive Session 7: 45 pm. And returned to regular session at 8:05 pm. No action was taken by the City Commission.
14. Adjournment. Commissioner Perez moved to adjourn the meeting and the motion was carried.

RIO HONDO POLICE DEPT. has adopted a detailed written policy on racial profiling. Our policy:

- 1) clearly defines acts constituting racial profiling;
- 2) strictly prohibits peace officers employed by the RIO HONDO POLICE DEPT. from engaging in racial profiling;
- 3) implements a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the RIO HONDO POLICE DEPT. if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the RIO HONDO POLICE DEPT. has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- 4) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the RIO HONDO POLICE DEPT. who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the RIO HONDO POLICE DEPT. policy;
- 6) requires collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a warning or citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
  - a. the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
  - b. whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
  - c. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual;
  - d. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury during the stop;
  - e. the location of the stop;
  - f. the reason for the stop.
- 7) requires the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
  - a. the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
  - b. the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

The RIO HONDO POLICE DEPT. has satisfied the statutory data audit requirements as prescribed in Article 2.133(c),

Code of Criminal Procedure during the reporting period.

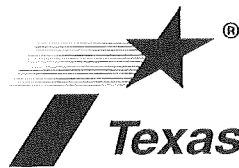

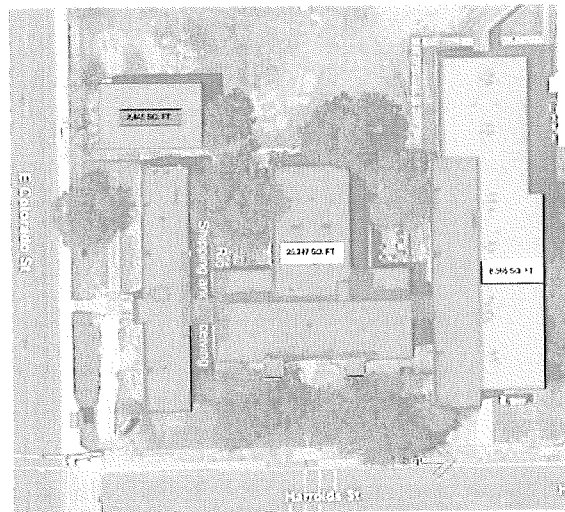


Figure 2 - Vicinity aerial photo of site. The project site is located between Harrolds St and N Reynolds St on the north side of E. Colorado St in Rio Hondo. The original structure was constructed in 1924 (shown in blue), the addition to the north side completed in 1995 (shown in green) and the open metal canopy structure in 2005 (shown in red)

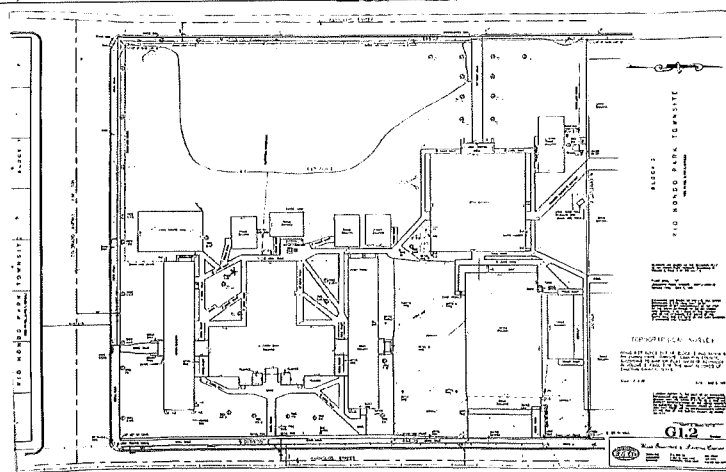
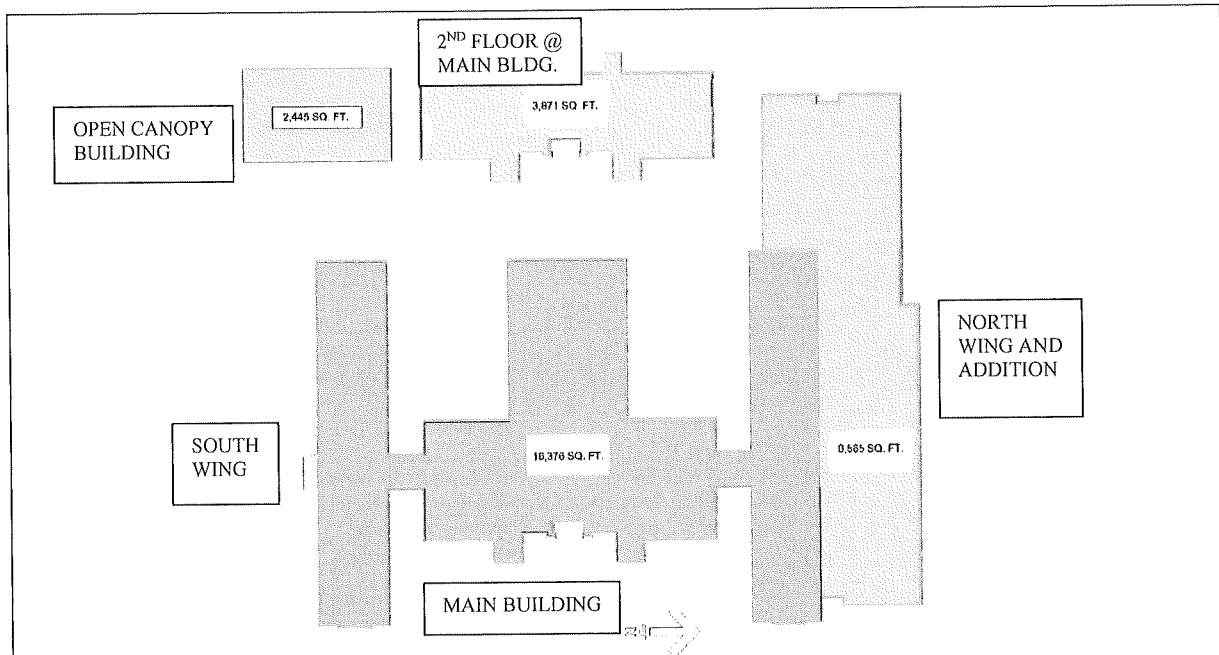


Figure 3 - Survey performed by Willms Engineering and Survey Company on June 9, 1995

The unoccupied school buildings are currently used by Rio Hondo I.S.D as storage and a small portion of the central original building shown in blue is currently being leased to a local church organization. The 1924 building was arranged in a footprint of a main central two-story structure with north and south wings joined by breezeways. At the rear of the main building, a large open multipurpose area served as an auditorium for student gatherings. The programming of the buildings consists of (a) administrative offices (b) cafeteria/multipurpose and former kitchen (c) large multipurpose room (d) classrooms (e) mechanical, electrical, and restrooms.

The 1995 addition incorporated the original 1924 north wing footprint with the new attached building. Currently, the north wing has been modified and closed off to the main building at the north breezeway. Additional modifications to the original building include adding an elevator shaft in the northwest courtyard. It appears that the central wing behind the two-story building has been renovated to raise the ceiling and roof to its current height. Two rear windows have been modified for the roof to have been altered to his current height indicating that the current roof height is not the original design.
